However, I am certainly looking forward to a less frenetic pace and trying to find a balance between contract work and the life that Paul and I have built over the past nearly 20 years with the most amazing circle of friends and colleagues across a wide range of disciplines in many outstanding organisations.

Rest assured, that I have the absolute faith that the new leadership at Living Positive Victoria will extend the organisation even further and will continue to champion the role that PLHIV remain both central and vital to the HIV response in Victoria, Australia and abroad.
