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Up... and raring to go!

There was an atmosphere of great energy and enthusiasm present at the launch of the new People Living With HIV/AIDS Victoria (PLWHA Vic) organisation at Barracuda Bar in Collingwood on July 18. Over one hundred PLWHA, friends and well-wishers attended the function to officially kick-off the new advocacy body for HIV positive people and to meet the newly appointed Executive Officer - Bridget Haire - and the members of the PLWHA Vic Board.

"We were very pleased with this response to the new organisation" said PLWHA Vic President John Dyer, "and for those of us who have been involved in the fairly long and difficult process of drawing up the new organisation's rules, negotiating funding arrangements and carrying over business from the old PLWHA program of the Victorian AIDS Council/Gay Men's Health Centre (VAC/GMHC), it seemed to make effort worthwhile."

The benefits of independence

"The benefits for positive people having their own organisation separate from the AIDS Council will be clear to many PLWHA," said Dyer. "While we will always strive to have good collaborative relationships with the major HIV/AIDS organisations in this State, it is very important that we feel totally free to put an independent view on any matter that we think best represents the views of positive people. This may even include criticisms or suggestions for improvement of VAC/GMHC's service delivery for positive people - if members of our constituency were to raise concerns in this area."

"We do expect, though, that our main focus for PLWHA advocacy over the next year will be in trying to improve the quality of service delivery by public health providers, particularly from hospitals and the serious problems which could develop in dental services. We will be trying to see that services



The structural review of the VAC/GMHC created a new HIV Services program which incorporated the former support program with the services provided by the old PLWHA program. This new means that the Treatment Officer, the Peer Support Officer and services offered by the Positive Living Centre are now entered by this new program.
